The initiative should be well defined, measurable, scalable, and having wider impact on the preventive /therapeutic and outcome-based healthcare scenario. 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Training & Skill Development Initiative of the Year	To recognize the excellence and innovative strategies for healthcare skilling and training over & above their routine and regulatory requirements, that have led to a significant increase in numbers as well as quality and relevance of healthcare professionals including nursing, paramedical, and other support staff efficiency. Technology Transformation Initiative of the Year	To recognize organizations that have delivered outstanding initiatives in leveraging technologies to revolutionize and enhance healthcare practices. This category highlights initiatives that demonstrate innovative technologies, integration of various solutions such as artificial intelligence, data analytics and drive overall transformation within the healthcare sector.
